GARBAGE COLLECTION TIPS

- Have your containers out to the curb at 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.
- The front of your container should face the street when your can is on the curb for collection.
- Containers must be 3-4 feet from each other and other objects such as mailboxes, telephone poles, trees, and vehicles.
- Please bag or secure your garbage to help prevent litter.
- Please do not overfill your container. Anything longer than four feet is too large for any of the containers.
- As per city ordinances, please do NOT allow your waste container to sit out on the street for longer than 24 hours before and after your collection day.
