#### Department Reports:

Mayor Thomas G. Bailey – 1) Mayor Bailey and Don Hartle met with Mayor Buist from Mendon concerning Wellsville City losing money in handling Mendon City citations. Mayor Buist stated that he discussed this issue with the treasurer of Mendon, and they had an idea of what was going on. Mayor Buist is planning to meet with the County Attorney to discuss possibly going with the County Court. Will wait to see what Mayor Buist and Mendon City decides to do.

Jackie D. Orton – 1) Wellsville City signs along the highway – checked with UDOT and drove around the City limits of Wellsville. The signs along the highway have to be a certain size and Wellsville City is responsible to purchase them. Don Hartle stated that the signs would be approximately \$100 each. Carl Leatham stated that the general public doesn't know where the Wellsville City limits are. The Planning Commission would like the signs installed so that it defines the border of Wellsville City. Ron Case has no strong feelings either way. Gary Bates agrees with Ron Case. Carl Leatham stated that the Planning Commission asked to have the signs installed. The signs should read "Welcome to Wellsville City". Mr. Orton will continue to work on the matter to get them made and installed.

Gary Bates – 1) Remind citizens in the newsletter about door-to-door sales and having the proper permit to do sales in Wellsville City.

2) Have had several young kids selling different things for different schools – most kids are coming on their own. Concerned about their safety and asked to have phone calls made to the principals of the schools about this. Jackie D. Orton stated that he will contact the principals of Wellsville Elementary and Willow Valley Middle School concerning this issue.

3) Theft at the Wellsville Dam – someone cut down a pine tree that was donated. Junior Kerr met with the Deputy Sheriff, and Wellsville City should be receiving a copy of the report. Asked about putting up gates with a lock. Dee Stoddard goes down to the dam every day. Will talk to Dee Stoddard about this issue.

4) A car clipped the telephone pole by Dean Haslam's and took out a tree. Will look into this issue.

5) Arlyn Brenchley attended the Recreation Committee meeting – about an acre on the north end of the dam – water board will remove the stumps and old debris – have an Eagle Scout clean up the area for a picnic area or a dog run area.

6) Would like to nominate Amy Erickson to work on the Recreation Committee with publicity and keeping up the web site.

7) Looking for a replacement for the baseball coordinator to work with the existing director for a year before taking over.

8) Discussed stairs from 600 South going east down to the bridge – discussed with City Engineer Chris Breinholt and Project Manager Mark Reeder – doesn't need to be engineered. Mr. Reeder will give

Wellsville City a bid. When the bid comes in, Wellsville City will discuss the matter to see if it is something they would like to pursue. Don Hartle expressed concern about the need for both a trail and stairs going down to the bridge. Can't afford both. Parks and Recreation impact fees have all been used.

City Manager/Recorder's Report:

Don Hartle – 1) Discussed fee for using the bowery for commercial events. Don Hartle recommended we charge \$1.00 per person. City Council all agreed.

2) The Public Works Department doesn't have the capability to remove snow from off of the trail in the winter. Asked what the intent is? City Council has no intent to push the snow in the winter.

3) Handed out a copy of a letter that was sent to Dave Bell at USU concerning the trees on the City street right-of-way.
