EXTRA RECYCLING FOR THE HOLIDAYS-The Christmas season often brings extra boxes, wrapping paper, and other recyclable items. In order to help accommodate this extra recycling, the Logan City Environmental Department will provide one extra recycling collection during the holiday season. From December 27, 2010 to January 7, 2011 all residents will have their recycling collected on their collection day both weeks. TREE RECYCLING-Tree recycling is available from December 26, 2010 thru January 10, 2011. The recycling drop off spot is located behind the fire station (approximately 65 East Main)

BUSINESS LICENSES-As a reminder to those residents who may have a home occupation, it is time to renew your business license for 2011. If you have received a renewal form, please return the form to the city offices ASAP. If you are currently engaged in a business here in Wellsville, but are not licensed, please contact the City Office to apply for a business license. It is a Class B Misdemeanor to operate a business without a business license.

FUNDRAISING-When school fund raising activities suggest going door-to-door, it is recommended that parents accompany their children. Although we live in a very safe community, precautions should be taken to protect our children.

SOLICITORS-Door to door solicitations require a license that is obtained at the city office. If a door to door salesman comes to your home, you should ask for proof of a solicitors license. If this person is unable to provide proof of a solicitors license, then you may direct them to the city office or call dispatch at phone number 716-9400.

WHAT IS STORM WATER RUNOFF? Storm water runoff is the rain or snowmelt that runs off streets, rooftops, parking lots, lawns and other land surfaces. As communities develop, more impervious surfaces are created and less rainfall can soak into the ground. This increases flooding and stream bank erosion. Storm water also picks up pollutants as it flows across land surfaces. Pollutants include: ■Sediment from bare areas like construction sites ■Pesticides and fertilizers from lawns, parks, and roadsides ■Bacteria and disease causing organisms from pet waste and failing septic systems ■Oil and grease from car leaks, gas stations and industrial areas ■Salt used on roads and driveways ■Toxic chemicals from leaks, spills, and auto wear and exhaust. Sometimes pollutants (e.g., used oil, paint, thinners, etc) are illegally dumped directly into storm drains and waterways.

WHERE DOES THE STORM WATER GO? Storm water typically flows into storm drains on parking lots and street curbs where it enters underground pipes called storm sewers. Unlike sanitary sewers, storm sewers do not lead to a treatment plant. So storm water runoff directed to storm sewers usually receives no treatment before entering our streams, rivers, and lakes. The result can be the contamination of our drinking water supplies. See next month's newsletter for tips on what you as a citizen can do to help prevent storm water pollution.
