BURN PERMITS

The Spring open burning season for Wellsville City residents will be from April 15th to May 15th. Anyone wishing to burn tree limbs, branches, garden clippings, and bushes may request a burn permit from Jerald Leishman at **(435) 245-6677**.

BURN PERMIT CONDITIONS

1. No burn permits issued on Sunday
2. Burn permits will not be issued if the air quality is below 500 or on yellow or red burn days.
3. Burning of household or construction waste, rubbish, cardboard, plastics, tires, hazardous chemicals, fuels, and other processed or man-made material is prohibited.
4. Burn piles are to be kept small.
5. All open burns must be 50 feet away from any building or construction.
6. Someone 18 or older must be with the fire at all times.
7. A water source must be kept nearby
8. All fires must be out by dark.
9. If your fire extends beyond your control, immediately call the fire department at 911.

CITIZEN ALERT

ANIMAL CONTROL

Several complaints have arisen concerning dog owners allowing their dogs to run without restraint on the Wellsville Dam trail. Please be aware that dogs must be under physical control at all times, whether on a leash, chain, or in an enclosure. There have also been several complaints about barking dogs. As a dog owner, please take an active roll in being aware if your dog is causing a disturbance. Our animal control officer is continually patrolling for dogs that are running loose and causing a disturbance. Citations will be issued to dog owners who are not in compliance. STORMWATER

Alternatives to Toxic Substances: Using alternative products instead of toxic substances found in the home are cleaners, automotive products and pesticides. Other common hazardous substances that are found in homes are fertilizers, paints, and fuels. Prevent such substances from entering stormwater by substituting these common household products with safer, less toxic alternatives:

- Aerosols-Use pump-type or non-aerosol products.
- Art Supplies-Purchase water-based paints or inks. They should not contain lead or other toxic materials.
- Batteries-Rechargeable batteries are a cost-effective alternative to disposable batteries.
- Gasoline-Not driving at all is the best way to reduce gasoline use. Carpooling, walking, bicycling, and public transportation are other viable options.
- Pesticides-Keeping homes and gardens tidy reduces the food supply for insects pests, averting the need for pesticides. Onion, garlic, and marigold plants help keep garden pests at bay.
