VETERANS RECOGNITION

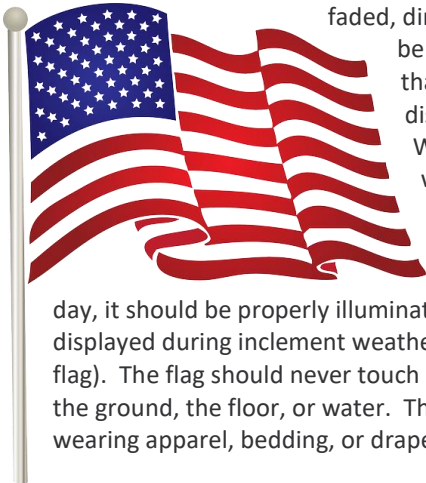

MEMORIAL DAY FLAG PLACING

As part of the Wellsville City Memorial Day celebration, we will be placing flags on the graves of all the Veterans buried in the Wellsville City Cemetery. This event will take place on **Saturday, May 24th at 9:00 a.m.** Come and show your respect and honor those who have sacrificed and served our country by helping place flags on each of our hometown Veteran's grave sites. Flags will need to be gathered on **Saturday May 31st at 9:00 a.m.** If you have any questions, please contact the city office.

FLAG ETIQUETTE

Are you flying an American Flag from your home? If so, keep in mind that Memorial Day and Flag Day are coming right up and now is a good time to check the condition of your flag. Any flag that is faded, dirty, tattered or worn should be retired. An American flag that is no longer suitable for display can be received at the Wellsville City Office. We will make sure that the flag is retired in the proper way. If the American flag is displayed 24 hours a day, it should be properly illuminated and should not be displayed during inclement weather (unless it is an all-weather flag). The flag should never touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor, or water. The flag should not be used as wearing apparel, bedding, or drapery. (4 USC Ch.1:THE FLAG)



MEMORIAL DAY FLOWERS AND DECORATIONS MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE CEMETERY BY MONDAY, JUNE 2ND AT 7:00 A.M. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING ON OR AROUND HEADSTONES. EVERYTHING LEFT IN THE CEMETERY WILL BE DISPOSED OF. THIS INCLUDES FLOWERS, STATUES, MOMENTOS, HOOKS, SOLAR LIGHTS, ETC.

GARBAGE COLLECTION ON WELLSVILLE MILE DAY

As in the past, the Wellsville Mile will be held around the block where the new pickleball courts are located. Wellsville Elementary is asking the residents who live along these streets (1st East, 1st South, 2nd South and Center) to have all garbage cans to the curb prior to 7:00 am the morning of Tuesday, May 20, 2025. STORMWATER TIPS

Did you know? Storm drains are not part of the sanitary system. Stormwater often goes untreated, directly into our rivers and lakes. Storm drains and drainage swales are constructed to prevent flooding by diverting rainwater off streets into local waters. Improperly used or disposed chemicals can mix with the storm water and contaminate local rivers and lakes. These chemicals can end up in the aquifer, the source of our drinking water!

PICKLEBALL COURTS OPEN

Please help keep these courts enjoyable for everyone by respecting this property. Please notify the city office of any vandalism immediately! You will notice two new benches at the courts donated by local citizens. If you or your family are interested in donating a bench at any park in Wellsville, please contact the city office.

OPEN BURN PERMITS APRIL 1 THRU MAY 31

All open burns require a burn permit that can easily be obtained prior to burning on the Cache County website at <https://www.cachecounty.gov/fire/getburnpermit.html>. For any agricultural burns, please notify our local Fire Chief Mason McBride (435)757-7490 or for outside city limits please call Cache County Fire Warden Dallin Bodrero (435)535-6434 prior to burning. All burns require a clearing index above 500 ft., this is so the smoke rises up and out.
