Wellsville City Utilities is asking all its customers who use culinary water to water their lawns to do so on designated days of the week based on your house number. It's simple to do. Check your house number, even or odd?

EVEN HOUSE NUMBERS===→ MONDAY, WEDNESDAY, FRIDAY If your house number ends in an even number, such as 532, 1298, 164, etc. water only on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday.

ODD HOUSE NUMBERS=== → TUESDAY, THURSDAY, SATURDAY
If your house number ends in an odd number, such as 127, 573,
1587, water only on Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday.

WHAT ABOUT SUNDAY? We all take a break by <u>not</u> watering on Sunday, but our yards will still receive enough water to keep them healthy and attractive. Typically, even in dry and hot conditions, it is not necessary to water every day. *Thank you for your cooperation in helping to conserve our water*.


