FALL STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION TIPS

Raking leaves into a stormwater inlet creates more pollution of local streams and waterways. Not only do leaves contribute to stream pollution, but they can also cause localized flooding if they clog storm drains and pipes. Help protect our nearby waterways from excess nutrients and never rake leaves into a storm drain. Grass clippings and fallen leaves are truly a valuable resource and good for your landscape. Grass clippings left on the lawn can provide up to 25% of your lawn's total fertilizer needs and leaves contain 50-80% of the nutrients a plant extracts from the soil and air during this season. To keep these nutrients where they can nourish your lawn, mulch your grass clippings and leaves and keep them on your lawn, or compost them.
