TRAILS SAFETY REMINDER

The trails and sidewalks in Wellsville City are for non-motorized use. If the bike you are riding does not have peddles it is not an E-bicycle and is NOT PERMITTED in these areas. These vehicles are in fact a form of motorcycle, and will be treated as such under the law, and will be considered as trespassing. As with any bike, a bell or warning system is recommended to protect others and yourself when approaching other users and blind spots. Parents, please remind your kids these rules are for everyone's safety.



WATER CONSERVATION AT HOME

Wellsville City is asking all its customers who use culinary water to water their lawns to do so on designated days of the week based on your house number. It's simple to do. Check your house number, even or odd?

EVEN HOUSE NUMBERS====> MONDAY, WEDNESDAY, FRIDAY

If your house number ends in an even number, such as 532, 1298, 164, etc. water only on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday.

ODD HOUSE NUMBERS====> TUESDAY, THURSDAY, SATURDAY

If your house number ends in an odd number, such as 127, 573, 1587, water only on Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday.

WHAT ABOUT SUNDAY? We all take a break by not watering on Sunday, but our yards will still receive enough water to keep them healthy and attractive. Typically, even in dry and hot conditions, it is not necessary to water every day. **Thank you for your cooperation in helping to conserve our water.**



OPEN BURN PERMITS APRIL 1 THRU MAY 31

All open burns require a burn permit that can easily be obtained prior to burning on the Cache County website at <https://www.cachecounty.gov/fire/getburnpermit.html>. For any agricultural burns outside these days, please notify our local Fire Chief Mason McBride (435)757-7490 or for outside city limits please call Cache County Fire Warden Dallin Bodrero (435)535-6434 prior to burning. All burns require a clearing index above 500 ft, this is so the smoke rises up in the air and out away from homes.

STORMWATER TIPS

Please remember that sending storm water into the city sewer system is illegal and can result in the city being fined an exorbitant amount by the EPA. Pumping ground water from your basement or yard into the city sewer system is not allowed. Please be prepared to discharge problem ground water into ditches or into your own yard, as far away from other structures as possible (but not into your neighbor's yard). Thank you for your help!
