WATER CONSERVATION AT HOME

Wellsville City Utilities is asking all its customers who use culinary water to water their lawns to do so on designated days of the week based on your house number. It's simple to do. Check your house number, even or odd?

EVEN HOUSE NUMBERS====> MONDAY, WEDNESDAY, FRIDAY

If your house number ends in an even number, such as 532, 1298, 164, etc. water only on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday.

ODD HOUSE NUMBERS====> TUESDAY, THURSDAY, SATURDAY

If your house number ends in an odd number, such as 127, 573, 1587, water only on Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday.

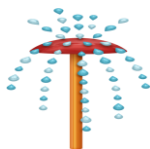
WHAT ABOUT SUNDAY? We all take a break by not watering on Sunday, but our yards will still receive enough water to keep them healthy and attractive. Typically, even in dry and hot conditions, it is not necessary to water every day. *Thank you for your cooperation in helping to conserve our water.*

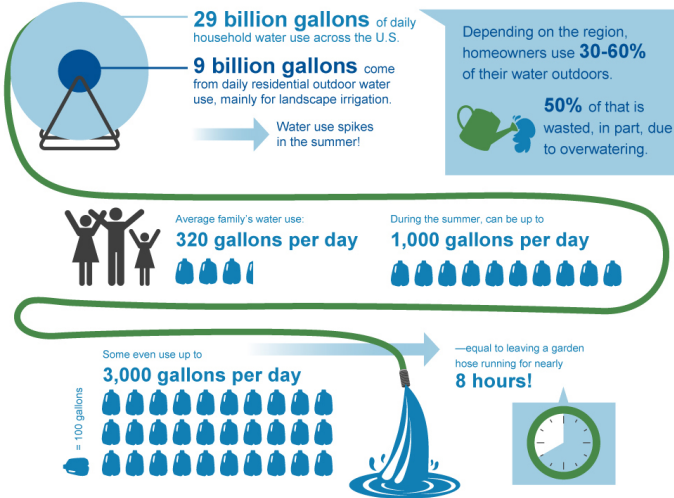
STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION TIPS

Raking leaves into a stormwater inlet creates more pollution of local streams and waterways. Not only do leaves contribute to stream pollution, but they can also cause localized flooding if they clog storm drains and pipes. Help protect our nearby waterways from excess nutrients and never rake leaves into a storm drain. Grass clippings and fallen leaves are truly a valuable resource and are good for your landscape. Grass clippings left on the lawn can provide up to 25% of your lawn's total fertilizer needs and leaves contain 50-80% of the nutrients a plant extracts from the soil and air during this season. To keep these nutrients where they can nourish your lawn, mulch your grass clippings and leaves and keep them on your lawn, or compost them.

SAVE WATER IN THE YARD THIS SUMMER

As temperatures rise in the summer, so does our outdoor water use, mostly on lawns and landscapes.



Simple Things We Can All Do



Simple Things Irrigation System Owners Can Do

Homes with automatic irrigation systems can use about **50%** more water outdoors.

Timing is everything:

Plan to water in the early morning or evening to beat daytime evaporation.



Go with a pro:

Contractors certified through a WaterSense labeled program can audit, install, or maintain home irrigation systems so no water is wasted.



Look for the label:

If your system uses a clock timer, consider upgrading to a WaterSense labeled controller that acts like a thermostat for your lawn, using local weather data to determine when and how much to water. They can reduce irrigation water use by 15%, saving nearly **8,800 gallons** of water per year.



Tune up your system:

Inspect irrigation systems, and fix leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads.

Make sure you're watering the lawn, not the sidewalk or driveway!

Just 1 broken sprinkler head could waste up to **25,000** gallons of water and **\$90+** over a 6-month irrigation season — the cost of about 300 daffodil bulbs.
